Well, the 2010 579<sup>th</sup> SMS Reunion is history. As most of you were aware, we joined forces with the Association of Air Force Missileers for their Bi-Annual meeting in Tucson, Arizona. Our thanks to Col. Charlie Simpson for his efforts in making our group feel welcome.

The AAFM National Meeting/579<sup>th</sup> SMS Reunion was held at the Radisson Hotel at Tucson Airport from October 6<sup>th</sup> thru October 10<sup>th</sup>. The accommodations were excellent (except for the constant jet traffic). All rooms were two-room suites at a very reasonable rate that included the hot breakfast buffet. About 160 members of the AAFM were in attendance plus spouses, family members, significant others totaling about 300. The 579<sup>th</sup> Strategic Missile Squadron was well represented with about 20 former 579<sup>th</sup> SMS members plus guests.

For those of you who have not seen the Tucson area or Davis Monthan AFB, the area is just beautiful, even in October. I have included several pictures of some of the areas we visited and pictures of our attendees (579<sup>th</sup> members).

Of particular interest was the Titan Museum Tour in Sahuarita, AZ. (about 20 miles south of Tucson). This facility is a restored Titan silo and launch control module and is often manned by former Titan personnel volunteers. Not the same as the Atlas-F facilities but definitely brings back some memories !! Our thanks to the tour guides who were as interested in our experiences as we were in theirs. This facility is open to the public every day but Thanksgiving and Christmas and the basic tour is about one (1) hour and costs around \$10.00/person. A full silo tour (about four (4) hours) is available by appointment on specific days for a cost of \$70.00. Another great tour(s) was the Pima Air and Space Museum in Tucson. This is a combination of indoor and outdoor exhibits as well as the opportunity to tour the infamous 'Bone-Yard', also known as the 309th Aerospace Maintenance and Regeneration Group (AMARG).

We were fortunate to have our Friday dinner in the Museum main building with the aircraft displays all around. This is an impressive display of historic planes up to and including the SR-71 Blackbird (capable of speeds in excess of 2200 MPH !! ) If you are ever in Tucson, make some time to visit this exhibit...

Our tour of Davis-Monthan Air Force Base included a luncheon on base, a flight line tour and an in-depth briefing on the mission of the CAOC (Combined Air and Space Operations Center from the CAOC Commander. The hospitality shown by the base personnel from the Commander to the airmen we encountered was EXCELLENT!

Other great locations we visited in and around Tucson included the San Xavier Mission, the Sonora Desert Museum and the Kitt Peak National Observatory (The Kitt Peak National Observatory is home to twenty-four optical and two radio telescopes representing eight astronomical research institutions).

This will be the **50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary** of the first 579<sup>th</sup> Atlas sites to go operational. In addition, the Walker AFB Museum has asked us to prepare a permanent Squadron display with a dedicated location within the Museum. As I noted before, the AAFM is providing us with a \$2350 grant to help with the costs.

While we were at the AAFM meeting, we met with Marie Talnack. Ms. Talnack is a board member of the Walker AFB Museum. Ms. Talnack approached us regarding the allocation of permanent museum display space for the 579<sup>th</sup> Squadron. In addition, she videotaped interviews with several of the Tucson attendees from the 579<sup>th</sup> for research and historical purposes. She has volunteered to help us with our return to Roswell in 2012 and will work with us on preparing the display space in the Museum. Marie will also help us with accommodations, planning, transportation and publicity for our reunion.

We are currently in the preliminary planning stages for the reunion, so any **suggestions** you may have, any **ideas** you would like to share, **complaints** about our last visit to Roswell, ANYTHING!!! 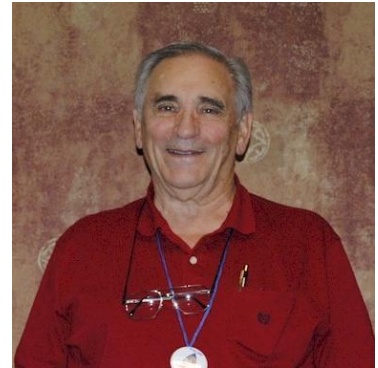

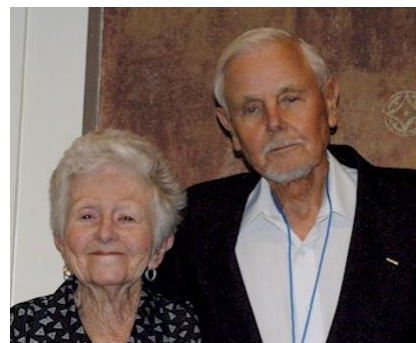

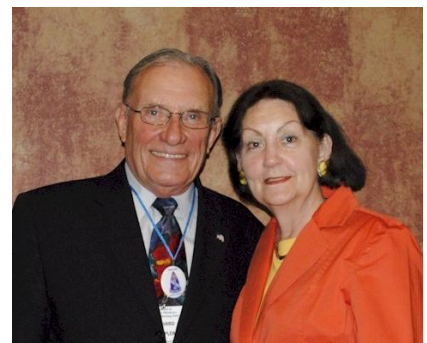
